
Umpires


The Association is fortunate in having a dedicated and enthusiastic army of Umpires. With the advent of the Pacific Games, more umpires will be needed and new examinations will be organised in May.

Many thanks to all of the "G force" who umpired so efficiently at the recent Classic: Sandi Zakoske, Linda Smith, Gill Sperring, Helen Young, Larry Parker, Peter Cheung, SC Lo, Len Dick, Brian Poynton, John Taylor, Bill Winn(if any name is missed off-sincere apologies) and last but not least, thanks must go to the Chief Umpire, George Sperring for all his efforts and time during the Classic and throughout the year

The Umpire shall decide all questions as to the distance of the mat from the ditch and the Jack from tho mat.

The Umpire shall measure any shot or shots in dispute and for this purpose shall use a suitable measure. His decision shall be final,





A Player, at the moment of delivering the Jack or his bowl shall have one foot remaining entirely within the confines of the mat. The foot may be in contact with or over the mat.

BOWLS IS A SPORT—SO **BEWARE** OF

"Gamesmanship," according to the Oxford dictionary "is the art of winning games by distracting one's opponent." It could be further defined as "tactics of a doubtful or discourteous nature resorted to by a player with a view to obtaining an unfair advantage over his

opponent or opponents."

Dick Folkins describes "Gamesmanship" as a subtle means of disturbing your opponent, in particular by upsetting his concentration. Many of us may subconsciously use gamesmanship to some degree. There are a few, however, who use it as a regular weapon, and I think this is unsportsmanlike. It may be excessive talking, the manner in which something is said, or the timing of the conversation, it may also be excessive following of the bowls, deliberate slow play, or yelling at the marker to move when he is in a perfectly legal position.

There are some bowlers, unfortunately, who forget that it is the game that counts; they think only for themselves and play only

for themselves.

Who doesn't know the bowler who stands beside his opponent on the mat and then, just as he is about to deliver the bowl, moves away or picks up his bowl? Or the bowler who deliberately goes on to the



bank to fetch something and then jumps back on the green when the other man starts his delivery?

Who doesn't know the bowler who moves about the back of the head during play? Or who talks loud thus breaking his opponent's concentratation? Or the singles player who has to know from the marker the position of every bowl in the head and then goes up to check things for himself?

Who doesn't know the hundred and one ways of gamesmanship by which your attention can be distracted and by which you can

lose the game?

Gamesmanship itself, however, must not be equated with anything as distasteful as deliberate cheating which fortunately, occurs very rarely.

To let the gamesman irritate you and force you to lose the game is stupid to the extreme. The easiest way to handle him is to ignore him and to carry on as though he and his antics don't exist. The chances are that he will defeat himself.

This is the best, the only answer to gamesmanshipl



The games were held from the 24th January to February 3rd and the opening ceremony alone was worth the trouble in getting to New Zealand Some of the African countries had flown via London transiting in Tokyo before arriving at Auckland. The opening ceremony told the history of New Zealand in colourfull dance sequences with the Maori warriors in full force; flags, dancers from all over the world in their national costumes, school children moving shiny blue silks simulating the waves of the Tasman Sea that were crossed by the settlers many years ago, all combined together to make a spectacle that will long be remembered.

The host club was the Carlton Bowling Green Club and nothing was too much trouble for their members, their kindness and support on the greens was second to none

The venue for the bowls was the Pakuranga Mixed Bowls Club although some pairs games were played at Mt Wellington Bowls Club a few miles away.
