

My congratulations to all winners of this year's league and national competitions and a special thank you to all clubs which provided the facilities for our games and meetings.



Report of the Men's Manager Asia-Pacific Championships 1997

The Championships were hosted by Warilla Bowls and Recreation Club, under the auspices of Bowls Australia and the Australian Women's Bowling Council, from 19-29 November 1997. The Hong Kong China Men's Team consisted of Noel Kennedy (Singles & Pairs), Ken Wallis (Triples & Fours), Anthony Carstairs (Pairs & Fours), Tony Tong (Triples & Fours) and David Tso (Triples & Fours). David was a late replacement for Bill McMahon who withdrew due to work.

The team arrived in Sydney on 11 November for practice and acclimatisation, and was hosted by Rosehill Bowling and Recreation Club and Parramatta RSL Bowling Club to four days of concentrated bowls between 12-15 November. On 16 November, the team motored down to Windang and the Oasis Motel our base for the event and another three days of practice on the venue greens. It was plain early on that the problem at this seaside club was going to be the wind.

On 19 November, there was a brief Opening Ceremony when each of the 14 participating nations were introduced and the respective national flags raised. The format saw all nations divided into two sections with the winner of each playing off for Gold and Silver, and the runners-up playing off for Bronze.

Noel met Kelvin Kerkow of Australia in his first game, led 24-21 and lay game on a couple of occasions only to see the Australian save the match with deadly heavy shots and then go on to win 25-24. Noel won the rest of his games, finished in the runner-up spot and

beat Norfolk Island in the Bronze play-off.

Anthony and Noel in the Pairs also only lost one section game, against New Zealand, the eventual Gold Medal winners, and comfortably finished runners-up to qualify for the Bronze play-off. Here they beat Canada.

In the Triples, Tony, David and Ken had a tough start with Fiji which they lost, but they followed this with some great bowls to finish in runners-up position, including a comprehensive victory over Australia. The play-off for Bronze against Singapore was played on a lightening green with excessive wind which saw the medal chances blown away. The team finished 4th overall.

The Fours started off confidently and won their first four games. However, Fiji proved the downfall once again and it needed a last game victory over New Zealand, the eventual Gold Medal Winners to clinch a place in the play-offs. This was not to be and the team finished 5th overall.

The Team finished in three play-offs, winning two Bronze Medals and taking 3rd place overall to New Zealand and Australia, a performance and result of which Hong Kong can be justly proud.

Report of Ladies' Manager Asia-Pacific Championships 1997

The 7th Asia-Pacific Bowls Championships 1997 were hosted by the Warilla Bowls & Recreation Club Ltd., south of Sydney, Australia from Wednesday 19 November to Saturday 29 November 1997. Fourteen countries participated, namely Australia, Canada, Cook Islands, Fiji, Hong Kong China, Japan, Malaysia, New Zealand, Norfolk Island, Papua New Guinea, Singapore, Thailand, United States and Western Samoa.

The Hong Kong China Ladies Team consisted of Linda Smith (Singles & Pairs), Lena Yeung (Triples & Fours), Angela Chau (Triples & Fours), Linda da Luz (Triples & Fours) and Stella Lo (Pairs & Fours).

The Team arrived in Sydney on 13 November and commenced six days of practice at the venue green. Accommodation was at the Oasis Motel in Windang only ten minutes drive from the venue.

The weather was hot and windy, making practice and matches difficult.

Report of Men's Manager Zimbabwe Triangular Series

This represented a first for Hong Kong China and an exciting prospect of competing on African soil against two very strong nations in bowls, Zimbabwe and, especially, South Africa. The event was held between 16-23 August 1997 in Harare and at Victoria Falls with each country playing each other twice, once at each venue. Pairs and Triples were played first, followed by the Singles and Fours.

The Hong Kong China Team consisted of Noel Kennedy (Singles & Pairs), Ken Wallis (Triples & Fours), Anthony Carstairs (Pairs & Fours), Tony Tong (Triples & Fours) and Bill McMahon (Triples & Fours).

The team arrived in Harare on 11 August to be met by Bill Cumming, President of the Zimbabwe Bowling Association and several of his committee members. It was then straight to the Highland Sports Club and a roll-up before being taken to our home accommodation with Bill Cumming, Mike McNeil and Kevin Heaney.



On 14-15 August, friendly matches were arranged against very good opposition from the Highland Sports Club and Mashonaland East Association, played at Alexandra Bowls Club.

The first round matches were played on 16-18 August at Harare City Bowls Club and saw Hong Kong China start off well with 3-1 wins over South Africa and Zimbabwe, dropping the Triples on each occasion. South Africa disposed of Zimbabwe 3-1 also and this left us with 12 points, South Africa with 8 and the hosts with 4.

The second phase was played at a new bowling green situated at the Elephant Hills Hotel



on the border with Zambia and within sight of the spray from the wonderful Victoria Falls, surely something that everyone should see. With delays in transport, the teams arrived late at the hotel and the matches were delayed with players fighting to finish in daylight. Playing South Africa, we again lost the Triples but the Pairs had to call a halt with darkness leading 20-17 with one end to play. The following morning before Singles and Fours, the final end was played and saw South Africa do the unlikely and take a three to tie. Hong Kong China however were not to be denied and took both Singles and Fours to win 5-3.

Going into the last match between South Africa and Zimbabwe, Hong Kong China were finished with 17 points, Zimbabwe held 12 and South Africa 11 and the best result for us had been a draw. This is exactly as it turned out with Zimbabwe finishing on 16 and South Africa, the obvious pre-event favourites on 15 points, a truly tremendous result.

Noel recorded three wins out of four, beating Neil Burkett twice to finish second in his discipline on shots. The Pairs finished top with two wins, a draw and one loss. The Triples had some good tussles and lost two matches on the final end, but finished without a win, whilst the Fours finished top of their discipline winning their first three convincingly and leading comfortably against Zimbabwe in their final match only to drop nine shots on the last two ends to lose 25-22 !

This was a wonderful tournament played against top class opposition and it was a tremendous achievement by the Hong Kong China Team to win. There is talk of another event in 1998 with England being added to make a four-nation event.

Report of Men's Manager

Four-Nation Tournament, Malaysia

Hong Kong was invited to a 4-Nation Tournament hosted by the Perak Lawn Bowls Association of Malaysia, held in Ipoh between 9 April and 16 April 1997. Apart from the host country, Brunei, Singapore and Hong Kong took part. The tournament was part of a long programme of training and experience by the Malaysians as part of their preparation for the Commonwealth Games in September 1998.

Representing Hong Kong were Noel Kennedy in the Singles, Mel Stewart and Ken Wallis in Pairs and Willie Lai, Tony Tong, Anthony Carstairs and Bill McMahon in the Fours.

The team arrived in Kuala Lumpur on 9 April and were met by Colonel Hussin of the Malaysian National Sports Council and then driven to Ipoh a few hours drive north, where we were accommodated in the Heritage Hotel.



The venue, some five minutes from the hotel consisted of two artificial greens very similar to Victoria Park, but with a truer surface and slower speed. After a day of practice, it was into the competition proper on 11 April with a brief Opening Ceremony. Order of play was to play each other twice in each discipline, with the top two teams contesting the title. Two games were played each day, starting very early in the morning and then again in the late afternoon, both to avoid the heat of the day.

In the Singles, Noel finished in top position and met Affendy of Malaysia in the Final. This proved to be a very close and exciting encounter. At 22-22 all and lying two down on the head, Noel fell short to give Affendy a chance of the match. However, he failed to reach the head and went to another head leading 24-22. Noel made him pay for the missed chance and drew three excellent shots to win the title 25-24.

The Pairs also finished in top position in the round-robin and played Malaysia in the Final.

This again proved to be a close and tough game with Hong Kong leading 15-14 and two shots on the head on the twentieth end only for the Malaysian Skip to drive the bowls off for a count of three and a 17-15 lead going into the last. Even though Ken Wallis killed the end three times, they were unable to secure the three shots needed for victory and had to settle for the Silver.

The Fours finished in second position after the round-robin and played Malaysia in the Final. The score remained tight for the first few ends before Malaysia gradually began to pull away as their Skip started running into the head with effect. Hong Kong again had to settle for Silver as the Malaysians consolidated to win 23-16.

A Gold and two Silvers was a creditable result under the circumstances and the whole team showed themselves to be fine ambassadors for their country both on the off the green.

The "Classic" Thrill of Hong Kong

BBC bowls commentator David Rhys Jones first visited Hong Kong two years ago to cover the Classic for The Times newspaper. He liked it so much, he returned last year. Here he gives his impressions of a unique place - and a very special tournament ...

When the overseas players arrive for the Manulife Funds Direct Classic in 1998, they will miss the almost indescribable thrill of putting down in Kai Tak - probably the most exciting airport in the world !

First impressions of Hong Kong ? (In the old Kai Tak days, that is !) Please note - admiration for the pilots threading their way between the skyscrapers comes later. The immediate, involuntary reaction of the first-time traveller is that of a customer on a white-knuckle ride in a Disneyworld theme park. Grip the edge of your seat, and stifle an hysterical scream! Bicycle clips definitely to be worn !

Even before the wheels touch the ground, there's a feeling of euphoria, which lasts, I can testify, throughout your stay in Hong Kong. The Peak Tram; the Star Ferry; the fish restaurants in Lamma; the sights - and smells - as you walk through Causeway Bay, Wan Chai, Central or Mong Kok. A day in Tai O. A day-trip out of Clearwater Bay. A ride in a tram - or in a sampan at Aberdeen Harbour. Pop into a karaoke bar. Take a ferry to Cheung Chau. Drink in Kowloon's Irish pub. Buy a Rolling Stones CD in the Temple Street market, that turns out not to be The Stones at all. It's the Hong Kong theme park !

The sensations are kept on their toes in the bowling clubs, too. Bewildered newcomers have never played in these conditions before. High-rise buildings surrounding the greens, the neon signs, the floodlights - and the police sirens that accompany the all-too-familiar cries of, "Well bowled Jim !"

Bizarre is the only word for it. You don't need drugs ! (Well, the odd glass of lager, maybe, just to get you through until you get home to Blighty and that pint of best bitter !) The drama is designed and built in to the place and the event. And you certainly stay high until you sign your temporary membership form, and depart.

My first visit was in 1996, my second last year. "Before and after", if you see what I mean. Changes ? Virtually none. The same hospitality, the same excitement, the same good bowling. It was great to see that bowls is as strong in the former Colony as it ever was. In fact, probably stronger than ever.


I understand the Classic was created to bring top level competition to Hong Kong, so that local bowlers could be inspired by world-class players - and improve their own skills by playing against them. And it works.

All the overseas stars swear that the calibre of local opposition improves year by year. Bowls is suffering a bit of a decline in some countries, but, in Hong Kong, the number of clubs is actually growing, and who knows, Drake's ancient game may spread into China before long. Gweilos were in the minority in the spectator gallery at last year's final, and I was impressed by the attention that every bowl received.

The packed stands were politely hushed during the moments of delivery, but as the bowl rolled down the rink, there was a growing murmur, and oohs and aayahs aplenty when it

reached the head, and did its best or worst. Then, plenty of warm applause. And, while the spectators at our events in the United Kingdom seem to be middle-aged to old, yours are marvellously middle-aged to young !

Young is an adjective that applies to the winners of the two Classic events, too. Singles Champion Adam Jeffrey, only 26, kept the title in Australia (holder John Noonan couldn't make it last year), while Andy Wills, 28, and Stuart Airey, 27, took a Classic title back to England for the first time.

It's a shame our game is still tarnished with an old-man's-game image in most of the countries of the world. True, old men can play bowls, and can do so pretty well. But most of the winners of the major championships these days are in their teens and twenties. It's about time that people in the media took it on board. Come on, you sports editors, and TV planners. Bowls can be modern, trendy, dramatic, even sexy ! Honest !

But what of last year's matches? In the Singles at the Craigengower Cricket Club, Noel Kennedy was the only local hope to get through to the quarter finals, after Hong Kong's Chi Chi Fernandes, Harry Thornton, Jacky Wong and Raymond Wu had all gone out in the third round.

Popular Channel Islander, David Le Marquand, played some outstanding bowls to beat Jeremy Henry, Mark Jacobsen and Stuart Airey on his way to the final, but had to give best to an awesome display of drawing from Adam Jeffrey.

In the Pairs, Adam Poynton and Bill McMahon, representing the Lawn Bowls Association, and the KBGC club's heroes, Anthony Carstairs and Noel Kennedy, got through to the last eight, but there were also some fantastic performances from the official Hong Kong pair, Tony Tong and Jackie Wong (who beat Scotland and Wales), and Kowloon Cricket Club's Jim Melbourne and Ken Wallis (who beat Australia and the Channel Islands).

David Cheung and George Chan, from Hong Kong Football Club defeated Ireland's World Outdoor Pairs Champions, Jeremy Henry and Sammy Allen, as well as New Zealand and Canada, while the Craigengower Cricket Club duo, Willie Lai and Tony Chok (whose brother Philip Chok, once reached the final of the World Indoor Singles Championship), numbered Scotland and Malaysia among their victims.


But who could forget the last group match between Channel Islands and Malaysia, when Aziz Saidun played a perfect bowl to thwart the Jersey duo - and put Wales through to the knockout stage? Or that magic quarter final between England and Scotland? And especially the ludicrous last end, when, with the scores level, the two leads, David Gourlay and Andy Wills both tried (in vain) to hammer the jack into the ditch!

When the two skips went to the mat, there was not one wood on the rink - and, after a tense, cagey duel between Stuart Airey and Graham Robertson, it went to the very last bowl, delivered by Stuart, before the result was known.

Andy and Stuart, who play at the front end of Tony Allcock's England rink in the outdoor internationals, but can not command a place in the national indoor side, went on to beat New Zealand's Bruce McNish and Brian Baldwin in the semi finals, and the proud holders, from South Africa, Gerry Baker and Neil Burkett, in the final.

So many high profile English pairs had gone before, each one tipped to take the title. But the first English victory in the Classic was achieved by two modest, compatible, but extremely popular youngsters, neither of whom was considered good enough to make England's Commonwealth Games team !

There must be a moral there somewhere !
