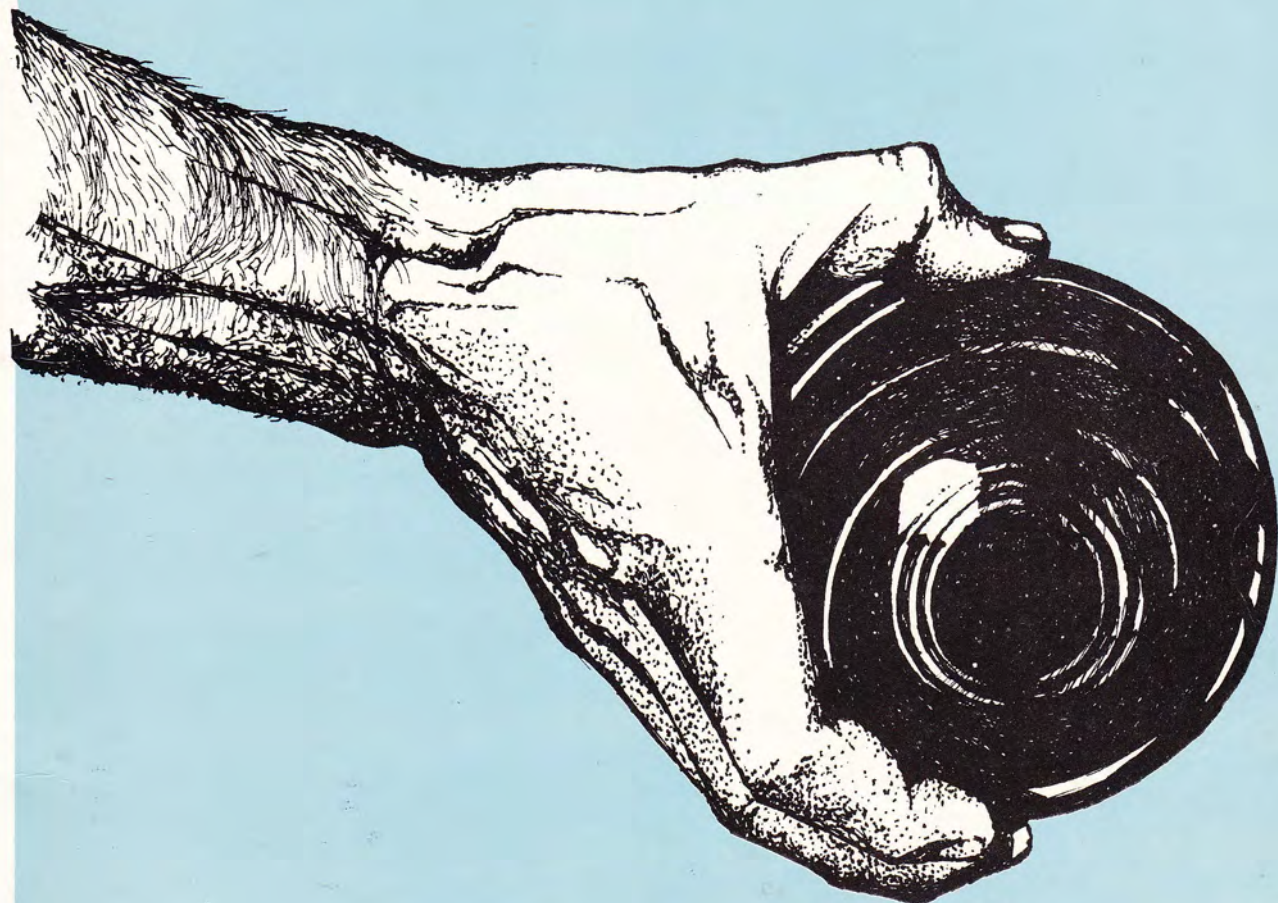

The other competition was the F.E.S.P.I.C. Games which were held in Jakarta, Indonesia and the Blind Bowlers performance was quite magnificent as they returned with 3 Gold, 3 Silver and 1 Bronze medals. We were extremely proud of the determination and sportsmanship shown by them during the Games.

Although the credit must go to the teams who represented us at these events, the people who worked behind the scenes must not be forgotten. The work that they did to raise funds to help to send players overseas is gratefully appreciated. Our heartfelt thanks to all who served on Committees and to all our members for their support.

There was little disruption to the League season as once again "Lady Luck" was kind with the weather. A special thanks to the League Sub-Committee for their efforts.

Hong Kong Lawn Bowls Association Annual Report 1986

Lawn Bowls in Hong Kong continued to flourish in 1986. The weather was particularly benevolent allowing a full programme of National Summer and Winter Leagues and National Competitions as well as our well established International Classic to be completed with minimal interruption.

Hong Kong was represented at the Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh, an event which, unfortunately, had more than its fair share of dreadful weather. Although we did not come away with any medals our men acquitted themselves very well and all of their performances were creditable. Keith Bosley played singles, M.B. Hassan Jr. and David Tso the pairs and Noel Kennedy, Mark McMahon, Danny Ho and George Souza Jr. the fours. A feature of the trip was the leadership of Team Manager Pat O'Dea. Under Pat's guidance the team made many friends and left behind a most favourable impression. Mention must be made of the hospitality shown by old friends West End Bowling Club who were also our hosts in 1970 and by Dalkeith Bowling Club. It is hoped that our International participation will be extended to both the Pacific Games in Papua New Guinea and World Bowls in New Zealand in the coming season.

The International Classic continued to be an outstanding success in both its Singles and Pairs disciplines. Invitations were extended to the four Home Countries, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, U.S.A., Fiji and Newcastle District. It was unfortunate that financial reasons precluded an invitation being extended to Israel but we were delighted to welcome back Canada after a break. For the first time the winners of our own National Pairs were invited to participate under the banner of the Association and it is expected that this innovation will be continued. Local representation in the Classic Singles was again determined by means of a knockout eliminator and there is no doubt that this approach gives us a stronger standing in this event.

The Singles featured play of an extremely high standard, the Australians dominating, in particular Paul Richards whose driving skills and ability to change to inch perfect drawing had the crowd amazed. Chi Chi Fernandes of Club de Recreio reached the semi final. The failure of any local club team to qualify for the knockout stage of the Pairs was a demonstration of the strength of the overseas contingent. The title was retained by George Adrain and Willie Wood of Scotland who defeated Rowan Brassey and Peter Belliss of New Zealand. The Hong Kong pair Mark McMahon and George Souza Jr. had the misfortune to go down by a single shot on an extra end in their semi final against the Antipodean pair. The sponsors of the Classic, Hongkong Bank, the Hong Kong Government, Cathay Pacific Airways and Waco Formscaff (Asia) have our appreciation for their support of our premier event and the Association intends to hold The Classic in 1987.

The National League was organised by the sub Committee under the Chairmanship of Bob Brown and Bells Whisky sponsored a top rink competition in each division. The winners were:-

The sub Committee also organised the two division Winter League which was again sponsored by the Berlitz Shipping Company and the winners were:-

National Competitions were organised by the National Competitions sub Committee under the Chairmanship of Boniface Lau. Home advantage to the quarter finals was continued with though this format has its critics. The calendar went smoothly due to the fine work put in by Boniface and his committee. During the year Boniface attended a Sports Administration Leadership Course sponsored by the Hong Kong Government.

Coaching courses at Victoria Park held under the auspices of the Urban Council have continued and are well attended, ensuring the well-being of the sport for years to come. It is difficult to estimate the value of S.C. Lo whose example and dedication in this field are most praiseworthy.

Chief Umpire Roger Hayes left Hong Kong after giving years of invaluable service to the Association and was succeeded by George Sperring. Roger had the unenviable task of Chairing the sub Committee set up to make a recommendation to the General Committee following the Manager's report arising from the Pacific Games and which resulted in the suspension of one of our leading players. Mention must also be made of the work done by Roger's wife Jackie who was part-time administrative assistant to the Association for a number of years.

New artificial greens at Police Officers Club and at Hong Kong Police Sports Recreation Club are now local features and the green on Lamma Island gives visitors to H.E.G.S.C. a pleasant ferry trip. Although a question mark hangs over the future of this green the resurgence of this club under the guidance of Peter Leybourn is noteworthy.

The changes to the Laws of the Game passed by the I.B.B. in 1986 have been put into effect. The ruling on professionalism may have an effect on our funding for overseas commitments and alterations to our Articles of Association are also being considered. It is regrettable that we were not invited to send a representative to the World Indoor Singles Championships at Coatbridge or to the Midland Bank Pairs at Bournemouth in 1987 and it was unfortunate that Hong Kong had to decline an invitation to play a Test Series in New Zealand which clashed with the Classic.

Kowloon Cricket Club Visited China to give a demonstration of the sport and their annual Interport with Bangkok has been continued. Under the leadership of Ken Wallis this club is a strength on the local scene and is to be congratulated on its innovative approach.

From August the Association has employed a full-time Administrative Assistant and more recently the office has become computerised. In this way the organisational load on the Officers of the Association has been lightened and the various tasks perhaps made more enjoyable. General Committee ties are due to be awarded to Joe Kennedy, Len Dick, David Mak and Alfred Fong.

In conclusion I would like to thank the Ladies Lawn Bowls Association under the Presidency of Helen Young for their support throughout the year and the Officers and members of the General Committee of The Hong Kong Lawn Bowls Association under the patient Chairmanship of Clive Brindle for their untiring efforts on behalf of the sport of lawn bowls in Hong Kong.

Commonwealth Games Report

Men

At a meeting of the General Committee of the Association held on 24th January, 1986 the team chosen by the National Selectors to represent Hong Kong at the 1986 Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh was duly ratified. The team so selected was as follows:

During the weeks leading up to the team's departure in mid-July frequent practice sessions were held and the team is grateful to K.C.C., H.K.F.C., C.C.C., K.B.G.C., and P.O.C. for the use of their greens and the members of those clubs who turned out to play us.

Unfortunately our scheduled departure date of 11th July, 1986 coincided with the arrival of Typhoon Peggy forcing our British Caledonian aircraft to be delayed and our departure did not eventuate until the following day. This caused us to miss our scheduled connecting flight to Edinburgh and we arrived there finally 24 hours late and with little sleep. Despite this the team cheerfully met with members of the club allocated to host us during our stay and we spent the rest of the day at the Edinburgh West End Bowling Club where we were able to arrange to have the use of their green and play against their members in a series of practice sessions leading up to the Games themselves. This was the same club that had acted as hosts for Hong Kong during the 1950 Commonwealth Games and their friendliness and hospitality was overwhelming. On behalf of the team I would like to express our sincere appreciation to the Committee and members of the West End Club who were unstinting in their support of the Hong Kong team during our stay in Edinburgh.

We were also fortunate to practice at the Dalkeith Bowling Club and our thanks go to Mike Ferguson who made this possible and the Tipperlinn Bowling Club of which Hugh Ross and Norrie Smith are presently members.



The bowlers were accommodated outside the main Games Village at the Leith Nautical College which was very comfortable and well equipped but some distance from the bowls venue. Inept transport arrangements meant many hours waiting for a vehicle which never arrived and caused inconvenience to all the bowling teams which relied on the Games Organisers to provide transport. The venue for the bowls was at Balgreen, a complex which has four greens and space for large spectator stands to be erected around them. The clubhouse was small and the changing rooms for the players were inadequate to cope with the numbers involved. The standard of the greens was excellent and the surface true.

All seven players were a credit to Hong Kong both on and off the green. Play commenced at 9.00 am and the evening games did not finish until nearly 10.00 pm but throughout the Hong Kong players stuck to their task. Keith Bosley had some very good wins in the singles. Against Ian Schuback of Australia, the eventual silver medallist, and in front of television Keith matched his opponent shot for shot losing narrowly when his shot bowl on the last end fell away from the jack just before the marker could peg it. He finished in ninth position which was very creditable considering the number of world-ranked bowlers taking part.

The Pairs started out with good wins against Northern Ireland and Jersey. Losses to Malawi and Wales were more than compensated for when they beat Guernsey and then the Ward brothers from England. Scotland, the gold medallists, defeated David and M.B. in a tight game but two good wins against Australia and New Zealand gave Hong Kong a chance for a medal if they could defeat Canada. The Canadians got away to an early 14 to 5 lead which our pair were unable to recover from leaving them in 5th place overall behind Scotland, Canada, England and Wales.

The Hong Kong four suffered two early defeats to Northern Ireland and New Zealand but came back with a good showing to defeat Guernsey. Fiji then beat us narrowly but the next game saw a tremendous recovery with Hong Kong defeating the fancied English combination 25-17. Disaster struck the next morning when Botswana came from behind to pip us on the last head. The Hong Kong four shook off this defeat to beat Canada 27-19 and then hand the Australians the biggest defeat of the tournament winning 35 to 7. Unfortunately a loss to Scotland ended our medal hopes but a final victory over gold medallists, Wales, gave the Hong Kong four fifth placing finishing ahead of such countries as Scotland, England and Australia.

By Hong Kong's performance in the 1987 Commonwealth Games I am satisfied that our status in the international bowls sphere has continued to be improved and I am proud to have been associated with the 1986 Hong Kong Team.

It was wet. The wettest July in decades leading to games delays when the greens flooded. To the horror of the greensmen play was continued on the same day in spite of their protests. It was windy. At night it sounded like the proverbial Banshee. In spite of this the team battled on.

Although no medals were won by the Hong Kong team they were certainly in contention all the time. Joan set a spanking pace in her singles, while the Pairs, in spite of an initial loss, gained several victories. The Fours got off to a slow start but gradually gained momentum actually reaching their peak in the final game. The final results were:-
